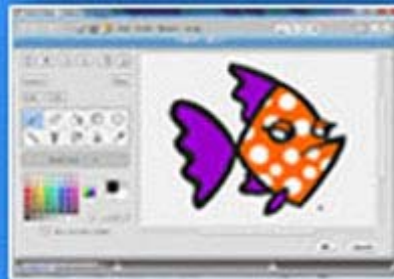

Year 13 Students interested in Medicine/ Dentistry

There are over 26 University Medical and Dental schools that require you to do the UKCAT admissions test. Check out which ones at www.ukcat.ac.uk The test is offered locally at Anderson House – above Grinders coffee shop. The closing date for registering to take this test is **27th September 2010**. However, due to high demand, students should register to take this test immediately to ensure they get a test slot locally. (it's also cheaper to do it earlier.) To register and book a test go to the UKCAT website at www.ukcat.ac.uk. The cost of the test is £60 if you take it between 6th July and 31st August 2010 or £75 if taken between 1st September and 8th October 2010.
